Gael de Guichen is a French chemical engineer graduated from the Polytechnic school in Lausanne in 1966. He first was in charge of the conservation project at the prehistoric cave of Lascaux, France. From 1969 until his retirement in 2001, he worked at ICCROM in preventive conservation, first for professionals and then for the public in general. Since 1984 he was Assistant to the Director-General. He has lectured and has been teaching for raising public awareness of conservation and protection of cultural heritage in more than 50 countries including most of the Arabic countries.

Between others programs, he launched the international press competition MEDIA SAVE ART, "The City Beneath the City" developed in 30 European countries and he contributes actively to the 15-year PREMA programme in Sub-Saharan Africa and then to the creation of the Ecole du Patrimoine Africain in Porto-Novo, Benin for which he created the EPA-fund. In 2012-2014 he was the scientific director of the program for Preventive conservation of the prehistoric cave of Altamira, Spain. Since 2010 he concentrated on reorganizing storages worldwide in the context of the Re-org programme developed by ICCROM. Presently, he works as a consultant and teaches in both Italy and abroad and he is advisor to the Director-General of ICCROM.
